## **Showing Respect - Demonstrating our Core Values**

Recently teachers have raised a number of concerns regarding student behaviour and the lack of respect that is being shown by some towards adults, their peers and our school environment. I'm hoping to enlist your support in discussing this with your children in order to turn some of this disrespectful behaviour around.

The tone of voice that is used, e.g. loud and aggressive, the expression on a face, the rolling of eyes, turning your back on someone; particularly the speaker, disregarding an instruction/request, back chatting, the language and type of words used, the list goes on . . . are all things that we as adults have experienced and recognise as disrespectful behaviour. We hope that our children will not show any of these behaviours, but unfortunately these are some of the concerns being raised by teachers.

Respect is one of our core school values. It is about having due regard for the feelings, wishes and rights of others and is shown through respecting themselves, others and the world around them. It must be integral to everything that we do and we have the expectation that all members of our community demonstrate this through all their actions.

I was recently reading an article by social worker, Janet Lehman, in which she began,

*"We often forget that children aren't born with a built-in sense of respect for others. While each child has a different personality, all children need to be taught to be respectful. From birth, kids learn to manipulate their world to get their needs met—this is natural. But it's our job as parents (and educators) to teach them respectful ways of doing this."*

She also wrote,

*It's important to remember that your child is not your friend—he's your child. Your job is to teach him to be able to function in the world. This means teaching him to behave respectfully to others, not just you."*

So how can we support our students to develop respectful behaviours? Manners are behaviours we use when we interact with others. We show good manners when we show respect. It is important to use good manners every day at home, at school, and in the community. Here are some simple strategies that we use at school and you can reinforce at home:

- model and demand good manners
- don't tolerate rudeness
- teach listening skills
- establish rules and have expectations
- follow through on actions or consequences
- encourage open-mindedness
- celebrate diversity
- be consistent (particularly as a parenting pair)

We would appreciate all families talking together about how we show respect. This chart is one that you might like to use to open the discussion or pop up on the fridge at home.

### ***Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)***

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
  - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
  - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
  - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

\* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [www.education.vic.gov.au/csef](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef)

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2019) or term two (23 April 2019).

### ***Working with Children Checks***

As part of the TVPS commitment to child safety, please be advised that, from the start of Term 3, all volunteers coming into school during school hours will be required to hold a current **Working With Children Check (WWCC)**.

This will include adults who are kindly attending school to help in the classroom, at the canteen or during an excursion or the swimming program. The requirement does *not* apply to parents/carers or their delegates involved in the pick-up or drop-off of students at school. Also, adults who are registered teachers, police officers or part of an allied service are not required to hold a WWCC in addition to the associated Police Check that is part of their professional registration.

To obtain a WWCC – which has no cost when applied for in a volunteer capacity - please visit this link and follow the steps. <https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/individuals/applicants/how-to-apply>

The sign-in process at the school office will change to accommodate this protocol – and will be clearly explained in a note prior to the start of next term. Visitors and service suppliers are governed under a separate arrangement, which will be explained within the [Visitors Policy](#), currently under review by the School Council.
