We are looking for some volunteers who would be happy to help in the creation of our Aladdin Ir Set.


Eva Wong (parent), is again taking on the role of our set builder, but we need some parent volunteers to help her with this big project!




FROM OUR TVPS JUNIOR SCHOOL COUNCIL (JSC)






TEMPLESTOWE VALLEY PS PERFORMANCE AND IMPROVEMENT REVIEW ~ TERM 2, 2021

As part of the improvement cycle, each Victorian Government School undertakes a review every four years, to ensure they are meeting minimum standards. The school community completes a comprehensive self-evaluation against the FISO continua of practice, which involves students, teachers and community members. The FISO Improvement Model:

The FISO Improvement Model identifies priority areas known to improve student outcomes. The Improvement Cycle steps out the process that brings FISO to life by progressively enriching our understanding of how school practices influence their performance.

The Improvement Model is structured around four, Victorian state-wide priorities that are proven to have a strong bearing on the effectiveness of a school:

- 1. Excellence in teaching and learning
- 2. Professional leadership
- 3. Positive climate for learning
- 4. Community engagement in learning

TEMPLESTOWE VALLEY PS PERFORMANCE AND IMPROVEMENT REVIEW ~ TERM 2, 2021

Each of these priorities has four dimensions, six of which have been identified as High-impact Improvement initiatives on which to focus effort:

- Building practice excellence
- Curriculum planning and assessment
- Building leadership teams
- Empowering students and building school pride
- Setting expectations and promoting inclusion
- Building communities

An independent analysis is completed of a school's performance against their goals and targets in their school strategic plan. The review evaluates the school's strengths, areas for improvement and the impact of its improvement efforts. At the end of the review, a new four-year school strategic plan is created and endorsed by the school community.

FISO Improvement Cycle:

The improvement cycle will help guide principals and school leaders to:

- identify priority challenges to improve on
- plan for how to address challenges
- identify and celebrate what is working
- adapt when facing barriers, or changes occur

The school review process sits within the 'Evaluate and Diagnose' phase of the FISO Improvement Cycle (refer to diagram above). As schools complete their review and start developing their School Strategic Plan, they move into the 'Prioritise and Set Goals' phase.

Pre-Review Self-Evaluation (PRSE):

During Term 2, 2020, TVPS teaching and leadership staff engaged in the Pre-Review Self-Evaluation (PRSE) process, in preparation for this year's review. Data and evidence was gathered and considered in terms of the school's performance and practice outcomes, with a focus on: - Student Wellbeing – improving student achievement levels, and curriculum content - teaching practice.

The resulting PRSE report, provided evidence including enablers and barriers, to support the evaluation of the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes Continua of Practice, (FISO Continua). The Principal then provided relevant documentation (according to the Reviewer as well as the PRSE Report and Data, to core members of the School Review Panel.

Preparation Meeting:

Last Wednesday, April 28, 2021, the Reviewer – Darrell Mullins, NEVR Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) – Mark Flack and TVPS Principal - Alison Rees, met to co-develop an agenda, methodology and processes for classroom observations and/or focus groups on the upcoming Validation Day.

The Review Panel consists of the following members:

The Panel will familiarise themselves with the PRSE report and other school data which provides evidence of school performance. The purpose of undertaking a broad, cross-section of classroom observations is to test and observe the school's practices with regard to student voice, agency and leadership; curriculum content; and teaching practice.

Validation Day - Tuesday May 18

On Tuesday May 18th, the Review Panel members will undertake classroom observations at TVPS to test the findings included in the PRSE Report, focussing on the instructional core. The Panel's views will contribute to determining the school's level of proficiency against the FISO Continua for the six High-impact Improvement initiatives. It will also guide the remaining phases of the School Review, by developing Terms of Reference focus questions and methodology for fieldwork activities. Fieldwork Day:

Fieldwork Day - Wednesday May 26

On Wednesday May 26, fieldwork will be undertaken to investigate the focus questions, as planned on Validation Day. Fieldwork may include classroom observations and focus groups, to further investigate and test the school's practices in student voice, agency and leadership; curriculum content; and teaching practice. It also enables the Review Panel to identify any other areas requiring more in-depth exploration.

Final School Review Panel Meeting - Monday May 31

On Monday May 31, as part of its broader discussions, the Panel (Reviewer/s, Principal and SEIL) will convene to share and discuss the review findings. Panel members will consider the instructional core in determining directions for the next Strategic School Plan (SSP), including goals setting, targets and Key Improvement Strategies (KIS) as per the FISO initiative. Following this meeting, a report will be developed and presented to staff and School Council. This report will form the basis for the first draft of the School Strategic Plan.

2020 - Annual Report to the School Community

The Annual report to the school community (Annual Report) provides principals and school councils with an opportunity to share the year's achievements and progress with the school community and reflect on the school's performance and how improvement efforts have impacted student outcomes.

The preparation and publication of an Annual Report is a legislative and regulatory requirement for all schools under the Education and Training Reform Act 2006, Ministerial Order 470 and 784, and the National Education Agreement 2008. It reflects the Education State's commitment to building pride and confidence in our government schools and highlights the importance of transparent communication about school performance with our school communities.

Principals must ensure that the Annual Report is completed, attested and submitted by the principal, and attested and endorsed by the school council president by 30 April each year.

The report – written about the previous year's achievements, (in this case 2020), - addresses data sets provided by the DET and is written in a set template. Focus areas include:

- School Context
 - O What is your school's vision, values, and purpose?
- Framework for Improving Student Outcomes (FISO), Achievement, Engagement and Wellbeing
 - Which FISO improvement initiatives and key improvement strategies did the school focus on in 2020?
- Achievement
 - How has the school progressed its student achievement goals and outcomes over the past vear?
 - O What are the highlights and proposed future directions and strategies?
- Engagement
 - How has the school progressed its student engagement goals and outcomes over the past vear?
 - O What are the highlights and future directions?
- Wellbeing
 - How has the school progressed its student wellbeing goals and outcomes over the past year?

- O What are the highlights and future directions?
- o Have any particular programs been implemented to support these outcomes?
- Financial Performance and Position commentary
 - Schools are accountable to the public and to the Government for the efficient and effective use of public funding, mandated by the Financial Management Act (1994) and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006.

The 2020 TVPS Annual report to the School Community is now available on the TVPS website.

NAPLAN - YEARS 3 & 5

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008. In 2019 The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Yrs 3 and 5 will be held in the fourth week of Term 2, starting on Tuesday 11th May. In Victoria, the NAPLAN Tests are administered by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCCA) on behalf of the Department of Education.

NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

<u>All students are expected to participate in the tests</u>. Students with disability may qualify for reasonable adjustments that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom. Some students with very specific circumstances may be exempted from participating in the tests. Please note that some of the information found on this page is given in multiple languages.

NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day. The use of services by coaching providers is not recommended.

NAPLAN - YEARS 3 & 5

In 2021, NAPLAN tests Australia wide will be an online assessment. NAPLAN online is described as a 'tailored test design' that adapts to correct and incorrect student responses, aimed at providing a more precise understanding of student achievement.

TVPS students will engage in at least one online practice test prior to the formal assessment, to help familiarise them with the format.

The dates and times of the testing are outlined in this table. Catch-up tests will be available for students who are absent on test days, up to and including Friday May 21st, (with the exception of Writing which must be completed on Tuesday May 11.

NAPLAN Tests Description:

Writing:

 Students are provided with a 'writing stimulus' (sometimes called a 'prompt' – an idea or topic) and asked to write a response in a particular genre (narrative or persuasive writing)

• Reading:

 Students read a range of informative, imaginative and persuasive texts and then answer related questions

• Conventions of language:

This test assesses spelling, grammar and punctuation

Numeracy

 This test assesses number and algebra, measurement and geometry, and statistics and probability

The best way for you to support your child with these formal assessments is to make sure they have a good night's sleep, followed by a healthy breakfast on the 'test days'. All tests will be administered in the first sessions of the school day, so please arrive at school in good time, without a rush or a fuss.

Later in the year, you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. This will describe your child's skills in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy as demonstrated in test conditions. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to the national minimum standards expected for students across Australia.

FAQ - What happens if my child is absent from school on test days?

Where possible, schools will organise for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the testing week. <u>Individual students are not permitted to sit</u> tests after Friday May 21 2021.

Working with Children Checks

As part of the Templestowe Valley PS commitment to child safety, at their June 3, 2019 meeting, the TVPS School Council endorsed the <u>Child Safety Policy</u> which included the recommendation that all volunteers and visitors to TVPS be required to hold a current WWCC.



So, from the start of Term 3, 2019, <u>ALL</u> volunteers, contractors, visitors, etc. coming into TVPS during school hours, or helping/supervising with out-of-school hours events, such as the Disco, etc. will be required to hold a current <u>Working with Children Check</u> (WWCC).

This will include adults who are attending school to help in the classroom, at the canteen, during an excursion or in-school event, swimming or sport event, etc. – any event that might require them to be in contact with children or working within an area where children might be frequenting without supervision, e.g. the canteen/OSHC rooms.

The requirement does not apply to:

- parents/carers or their delegates involved in the pick-up or drop-off of students at school.
- adults who are registered teachers, police officers or part of an allied service. (Not required to hold a WWCC in addition to the associated Police Check if part of their professional registration.)

Obtaining a WWCC

- No cost when applied for in a volunteer capacity
- Online applications can be made at: https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/individuals/applicants/how-to-apply
- Please nominate Templestowe Valley PS as the place where the volunteer work will occur and we
 will be sent through an official copy of your card.

TVPS WWCC Register

- A register of volunteers with a current WWCC will be maintained at TVPS
- Current WWCC registration please check at the TVPS Office to see if a copy is on file and you are on the register
- New applicants:
 - If volunteers nominate TVPS on their application form, TVPS will automatically receive a copy of their WWCC card when issued
 - If not, then volunteers are asked to take their valid WWCC card to the school Office where a copy will be made and included in the register
