I LOVE MY WORK! There are days when dealing with plumbing, balls on the roof and rubbish in the yard, etc. that make me question my sanity in becoming a teacher. But then there are days like today, when there are chortles of laughter coming from my office that make it all worthwhile.

I have said, and will continue to say, "Templestowe Valley kids are the BEST!" and here's my evidence. As principal, the door to my office is generally always open, and I do get lots of visitors. A number of the Year 1 students are the most regular, and usually start by saying, "I just wanted to say, Hi!, and see if you're having a good day." After they've checked that I'm okay, I get to hear all about what's happening in their lives. (The basketball final against Yr 2 students is a BIG topic of conversation at the moment.)

On the day of the photo, students from 1JM all arrived at the same time to surprise me, so we decided that we had a party happening. Hilarious! What was wonderful to hear was that all of them tried to include the others in the conversation. They listened to each other. They complimented each other and genuinely enjoyed being together. As I said, "I LOVE MY WORK!" It is so great to have our students all back on-site.

Getting Back to our New Normal

On a more serious note, over the last week or so, there have been a few questions from members our community asking as to whether we should be doing camps and the TVPS Production because of the:

- 1. possibility of future lockdowns, and/or
- 2. the cost to families.

When talking with our older students at the end of last year and in February about school, the one thing that kept coming up was the production and if it was going ahead. It was also the question that parents had. The second thing was camp. The third – the Asian Experience. These were their indicators of getting back to normal.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK continued

It is absolutely essential for our children to see that their world is returning to normal after the extended lockdown periods last year, and again this year. Anxiety in students has increased dramatically in the last 12 months, along with a reduction in resilience and independence, and a fear of what "might happen tomorrow". School must be their "safe known" as much as possible. We cannot be showing our students that we are living our life in fear of the "what if". We need to be showing them that we are confident with moving forward with what we have planned, and if we need to make changes as we go, then that's okay – that's what we'll do. Flexibility and dealing with things as they come up is what builds resilience. Having this modelled by our school and the adults around them supports students to develop strategies and coping mechanisms.

With regards to the cost to families, as a school we are acutely aware of this and try to keep the costs down as much as possible. However – our ultimate responsibility is to our students. If the staff firmly believe that student participation in an event is safe and extremely important for their development, then we will offer that event and support families to manage the cost.

Camps

Last year we talked at School Council (SC) about the value of camps and how shattering it was for our Yr 3 - 6 students to miss out on them. We discussed the value and benefits of camps in building students' confidence, independence, risk taking, social skills, . . . Camps were a priority to have this year for our students' wellbeing and attitude of returning to "normal". Unfortunately the Yr 3/4 camp was deferred because of the lockdown. We are still striving to hold some sort of camp for them this year, but the venue has been severely hit by storm damage and may not fully re-open this year. They are helping us with our search for a venue. The Yr 5/6 camp continuing as planned is now even more important for the students to see that school is back to normal.

As discussed at SC, the cost for a 5 day camp this year is \$90- more than what it was for a 5 day camp in 2018. The increase in costs is due to food, accommodation, and transport; all of which are out of our control. We offer support to families in the way of payment plans, etc. and are currently seeking financial support for specific students through aid agencies.

School Production – Aladdin Jnr

I know that the majority of our community truly values and celebrates the bi-annual production. It is a rite of passage for our Yr 5 & 6 students, a highlight for all students and an absolute marketing point for enrolments. You only have to look at the engagement of the community in following Lauren's Instagram clues last year, and after the announcement of what the production was to be, to know that this is an event that brings our community together. The recent School Review parent forums and survey feedback highlighted the importance of "TVPS community spirit", and the need to "build it back up again".

I also know at the moment that families are being asked to organise their child's costume for their routine. This does not have to be an expensive item. I know that teachers try to make the items as accessible and cheap as they can. Many of our families visit somewhere like Savers, or KMART for the base items such as a plain t-shirt etc. These items are cheap and can be re-used. I know that our teachers and families sometimes also buy items for other students in need.

I understand that whilst some parents don't like having to organise a costume, etc. and grumble about the cost, time, etc. once they see their child on stage – confident, proud and thoroughly enjoying themselves – their attitude changes. The number of positive emails that Lauren, the teachers and I receive after a production is evidence of this.

I hope this article addresses some of the concerns in our community, but all states very clearly what the school sees as important for our students, why we feel this way and our attitude to making it happen.

- showing trust and confidence in the child as a learner

- Have you booked a place in our Flying Start program?







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Working with Children Checks

As part of the Templestowe Valley PS commitment to child safety, at their June 3, 2019 meeting, the TVPS School Council endorsed the <u>Child Safety Policy</u> which included the recommendation that all volunteers and visitors to TVPS be required to hold a current WWCC.



So, from the start of Term 3, 2019, <u>ALL</u> volunteers, contractors, visitors, etc. coming into TVPS during school hours, or helping/supervising with out-of-school hours events, such as the Disco, etc. will be required to hold a current Working with Children Check (WWCC).

This will include adults who are attending school to help in the classroom, at the canteen, during an excursion or in-school event, swimming or sport event, etc. — any event that might require them to be in contact with children or working within an area where children might be frequenting without supervision, e.g. the canteen/OSHC rooms.

The requirement does not apply to:

- parents/carers or their delegates involved in the pick-up or drop-off of students at school.
- adults who are registered teachers, police officers or part of an allied service. (Not required to hold a WWCC in addition to the associated Police Check if part of their professional registration.)

Obtaining a WWCC

- No cost when applied for in a volunteer capacity
- Online applications can be made at: https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/individuals/applicants/how-to-apply
- Please nominate Templestowe Valley PS as the place where the volunteer work will occur and we
 will be sent through an official copy of your card.

TVPS WWCC Register

- · A register of volunteers with a current WWCC will be maintained at TVPS
- Current WWCC registration please check at the TVPS Office to see if a copy is on file and you are on the register
- New applicants:
 - If volunteers nominate TVPS on their application form, TVPS will automatically receive a copy of their WWCC card when issued
 - If not, then volunteers are asked to take their valid WWCC card to the school Office where a copy will be made and included in the register
