#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK – ALISON REES

With all our Year 6 students returning from quarantine on Monday November 8, Templestowe Valley PS will finally be whole again. It seems like forever since we were all together. With only six weeks until the end of the school year, we are going to try and cram as much as we possibly can in, in order to make the year memorable for our students. In saying that, our priorities for this period of time need to be clearly stated:

#### Mental health and wellbeing

Our highest priority will be the wellbeing, particularly the mental health, of every student and member of staff. This means effectively mobilising all available resources to support our most vulnerable students and enabling staff to access the relevant support services. (*More information can be found on Page 11.*)

When students begin to return to school there will be a period when some struggle to settle back at school. Some will be over excited to see their friends and others will be distant. The social and emotional health of students will be given a high priority and I ask that you be alert to identify your child/ren's needs and seek support from your child's classroom teacher, our Assistant Principal and Student Welfare Coordinator - Rob Cretney - or myself, (Alison Rees), as appropriate.

#### Learning and excellence

Some of our students have thrived in the remote and flexible learning environment, others have maintained their learning progress, and some have fallen behind, despite their best efforts and those of their families and teachers. Our priority will be supporting both those who need it to catch up and those who have progressed to continue to extend their learning.

#### **Transitions**

We will make every effort to ensure successful transitions for children moving from kindergarten into Prep and the Year 6s moving into Year 7.

We know some families are worried that their child may have to repeat a year due to the disruptions of coronavirus (COVID-19). There is little evidence to support the benefits of repeating a year to catch up. Instead, schools will use teaching strategies that draw on the best evidence available to help students meet their learning needs.

Parents, families and carers can be confident that the best option for almost every child is to stay with their peer group, whether that is moving from kindergarten into Prep, moving from Grade 6 into Year 7 at secondary school, or students moving up any year level in between. Our school, working with you, has shown it can be flexible and adaptable in responding to the challenges of coronavirus (COVID-19) and will continue to meet student needs as we look towards the end of the 2021 school year and ahead to 2022.

### FAMILIES LEAVING TEMPLESTOWE VALLEY PS

If there are any families planning on leaving TVPS at the end of this year, (students in 2021 Prep to Year 5 classes), <u>PLEASE</u> inform the **school office immediately**.

This impacts on our planning for classes and friendship matching. We are also required to notify the Department of Education students who are leaving our school at the end of this year.

### 2022 CLASS PLACEMENTS

It's at this time of the year that we move into the planning for 2022. This is a very considered and carefully thought-out process involving decisions relating to budget, class structure, specialist and support programs, teacher allocations, as well as student placement within classes.

At this time, and based on our current enrolment figures for 2022, the class structure for next year is 18 classes, no composites. The number of classes in each level is:

In placing students into classes for the following year, Templestowe Valley PS, and all schools, need to consider the social, academic, emotional, and in some specific cases, the physical needs of every child. Year level teams spend a great deal of time to ensure that classes are balanced and that the best interests of every student is taken into account when forming classes.

At TVPS we recognise the importance of fostering and maintaining friendship groups. We also understand that it is equally important for students to mix and learn with peers who have different interests. All students are given the opportunity to list friends and we ensure that they have at least one friend off that list with them in next year's class.

Please do not send the principal your child's list of selected friends. The children do that themselves as part of the process.

Please note: The TVPS Principal <u>will not accept requests for particular teachers</u>. The only requests that will be considered are those that concern the emotional and/or social needs of students.

Requests of this kind <u>must be made in writing to the Principal</u>, outlining <u>who</u> you would like your child to be placed with and <u>why</u>. Requests for individual teachers will not be considered. Please do not approach your child's classroom teacher and ask for them to arrange class placement for your child/children, as refusals might offend.

All requests need to be sent in writing to the Principal – Alison Rees at <u>alison.rees@education.vic.gov.au</u> no later than **Friday November 19, 2021.** Parent requests that are received after this date <u>will not be considered</u> as the process for creating the 2022 classes' starts after that time. Please note that all communications of this kind - requests are confidential.

### Year 4 Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program 2022

Dear Families,

For many years TVPS has been able to supply the impressive technology currently being used to enhance learning in and out of our classrooms. The key feature of this is the 1:1 device program for all students in Years 3 to 6; iPads for Yr 3 students, and notebooks/laptops for students in Yrs 4, 5 & 6. The significant cost of providing ever improving technology to our students has only been achieved courtesy of frugal budgeting, wonderful parent support and fundraising activities.

Due to substantial changes to education funding in 2022, we are no longer able to continue providing this level of technology to our students and need to introduce a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program at TVPS.

### The BYOD program will begin in our 2022 Year 4 classes.

This has not been an easy, or lightly made decision. The TVPS School Council; being fully cognisant of the proposed changes to education funding, the limitations on schools to raise monies and the current TVPS financial situation, has considered all options and fully endorses the introduction of a BYOD program.

We were one of, if not the last primary school in our area to move this way. The specified BYOD Laptop Program at Templestowe Valley Primary School will be central to our educational program. Laptops are utilised individually by students in every Year 4, 5 and 6 classroom; including specialist classes, as part of an integrated, holistic approach to student learning. By starting a BYOD program in Year 4, the three year warranties on the proposed devices cover the laptop and facilitates improved student learning to the end of Year 6.

### Vision

The vision for Templestowe Valley's BYOD program is to provide every student with access to technology that will enhance their learning both in and out of the classroom. In addition, TVPS aims to develop programs that integrate technology into student learning, allowing for transformative learning practices.

#### **CELEBRATING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**

### National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

In May this year, our Year 3 or Year 5 child undertook national testing in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy. These are called NAPLAN tests. These tests were administered to <u>all</u> Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students across Australia. These tests provide valuable information about how children are performing in key learning areas on a national basis. They give schools and teachers the opportunity to see how well their students are doing. It also helps them to identify the areas that they are excelling in, and those that might need further work. Another important feature of the NAPLAN reports is the identification of the national minimum standard for each year level. The National Minimum Standard Band for Year 3 is Band 2 and for Year 5 is Band 4.

The Year 3 and 5 NAPLAN student results were sent home to families last term. I would like to congratulate the children for their positive approach and performance in this national testing process. Our school results are excellent and we are extremely proud of all the students who took part and of the learning that was reflected in the results.

Our Year 3 and Year 5 School Summary reports are shown in the graphs below. In reading the graphs please note:

- Year 3 students are only reported on the graph to Band 6 and Year 5 to Band 8.
- The Green Box is showing results for all participating Victorian schools both government and independent.
- The Orange Box is Templestowe Valley PS.
- At the time of report publication, National comparative data was not available to schools even though it is listed on the graphs
- The line across the middle of the box indicates the **average** for that cohort.
- The box and whiskers key is below





#### STUDENT WELLBEING AND MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

It can be challenging to process and manage changes to routines and the uncertainty that comes with COVID-19 and related restrictions – including moving transitioning back to school.

To support our school community during this time, resources and support are available for parents, carers and families. These resources will help to support the mental health and wellbeing of our students and the young people in our care during this challenging period. I encourage everyone in our community to access these resources and take care of themselves during this time.

### Services and support for students and their families

A <u>Quick Guide to Student Mental Health and Wellbeing resources</u> is available for students, parents and carers looking to access expert guidance and resources to support wellbeing.

Supporting the mental health and wellbeing of our students remains our priority this year, especially during the continued COVID-19 pandemic and while students are learning from home during the current circuit breaker restrictions.

For students, the guide includes resources to support their own mental health and wellbeing.

- <u>Advice and resources for students</u> about ways to adapt their learning during COVID-19, to look after themselves and where to get help.
- <u>Wellbeing activities featuring AFL and AFLW players</u> with tips on managing stress, staying active and gratitude.
- <u>Smiling Mind mindfulness activities</u> for senior secondary school students, including short videos, online tip sheets and meditations.

The guide also includes resources and supports for parents and carers to help them build their child's physical and mental health and wellbeing. This includes:

- resources to support children's physical, mental health and wellbeing
- wellbeing activities and conversation starters for parents of <u>parents of primary school-aged children</u> and <u>parents of secondary school-aged children</u>
- <u>Raising Learners podcast</u> series
- how to <u>talk to your child</u> about COVID-19
- headspace is running <u>webinars</u> for parents and carers about offering support when they are concerned about a young person's mental health.
