Last year, Ivy N, when in Year 4, took it upon herself to start up a business crocheting bees for other students. She approached me with a carefully thought-out business proposition that she believed other students would benefit from. All of the money that she planned to earn was to be generously donated to our TVPS World Vision child. Whenever she had a free moment, you would see Ivy with a ball of wool under her arm and crochet needle in hand. She took orders, created the bee and then delivered them to her buyers with a smile. Awesome achievement Ivy!





At the end of last year when Hayley W had just finished Year 1, she decided that she wanted to do something to help other people who were suffering from cancer. Others might not have been so brave, but Hayley decided that she would cut off her hair in order to raise money. So she set about getting donations, and during the holidays followed through with her plan. Haley, with her mum's help and support, cut her hair for charity. When last I spoke with her, Hayley had raised over \$3,000. With that attitude, just imagine what Hayley will be doing at 18!!

And finally, the dynamic "Improve with Loom" team of Piper E, Isabella A, Carla P, Ariana C, Sabrina S, Jessica F and Willow H. Two weeks ago, this group of Year 5 students entered my office with a tentative, "We think we have a good idea about how we could raise money for our World Vision child." Yesterday, their idea came to fruition, and they raised more than \$100 in 30 minutes. The team has spent their lunchtimes making Loom items to sell and they were swamped by customers. The girls were so proud of what they achieved, and that their efforts were appreciated.

"Why TVPS?"

One of the things that I love about TVPS is where we're situated. We have a beautiful property tucked away in quiet suburban streets. Our trees and gardens, (not to forget the hill!), shelter our buildings from the road and give us a haven; a little bit of peace in an otherwise very busy world. Not being seen is an <u>advantage</u> as we're a bit of a secret and our community can enjoy using the school grounds in the evening and on weekends.

Having said that, not being seen is also a <u>disadvantage</u> because prospective parents often don't know that we're here and we rely on our families promoting our school in order to get enrolments. Enrolments mean more money for the school, and more money benefits <u>ALL</u> our students through the provision of our specialist programs, the upkeep and development of our school facilities, and resourcing of materials, equipment and technology.

What this means is that in order to maintain and develop the learning environment and opportunities we're able to provide for our students, we need to maintain and grow our enrolments. To do this, we have to be creative in how we promote and market ourselves to the wider community. One special event that we hold annually is:

This year it's being held on Saturday March 26th.

TEMPLESTOWE VALLEY PS - CONNECT - ENGAGE - CHALLENGE

Well it's the end of the third full week of school and our students are really starting to settle into their routines and classes. Developing confidence and independence was a thread coming out of the Meet and Greet discussions, so I thought it pertinent to start this week's newsletter with an article for parents by Michael Grose.

Language of independence building - CONFIDENCE by Michael Grose

"Families always develop shared language around the values that have strong meaning for them. If independence and self-sufficiency are important then it will be reflected in your family's proprietary language.

In fact, it's through shared language that culture exists. If you are looking to building a culture of independence in your family (or in your classroom) then creating your proprietary language around independence is a great way to start. The following twelve examples of independence-building language and principles behind them that will help you create your own family's language.

- "Never regularly do for a child the things a child can do for him or herself" Goal: Independence
- 2. "Is this something you can do?" Goal: Self-help
- 3. "Have you checked the help roster today?" Goal: Contribution
- 4. "Which of these two would you prefer?" Goal: Decision-making
- 5. "How can you make this happen?" Goal: Problem-solving
- 6. "We rely on you to do this?" Goal: Reliability
- 7. "What can you learn for next time?" Goal: Self-sufficiency
- 8. "How do you feel about this?" Goal: Emotional intelligence
- 9. "When you muck up, you make up?" Goal: Accountability
- 10. "How will you fix this?" Goal: Restoring relationships
- 11. "You need to do what's right, not what's easy." Goal: Integrity
- 12. "Let's find a way to make this happen." Goal: positive risk-taking

Independence-building is vitally important for parents. It's the pathway to children's competency, confidence and creativity and the short cut to resilience and real learning. We've gradually retreated from this approach over recent generations much to our children's detriment. It's time to help kids reclaim their independence. Getting our language right is a good place to start as family change always begins with shared language."

In order to reduce the parking and congestion outside of the school and make it safe for our children, we would like you to consider

This would reduce the hazards and would "switch" your child on for learning.

Why is walking good for kids?

Walking:

- is a great way to stay active for people for all ages; particularly for kids.
- is fun and interesting. You get to notice things along the way and meet people in your neighbourhood.
- is sociable. Children love walking with their friends, especially on the journey to school.
- makes children feel good. The exercise makes them feel calmer and happier and it improves their concentration, making it easier to focus in school.
- promotes independence and freedom. Children can make more decisions about their journey than they
 can in the car. They can choose to stop and look at something along the way and they can start to make
 decisions about road safety. For older children, walking independently offers some time to themselves.

COVID-19 Protocols - Entry & Exit Process continued

For Prep Students

For Term 1 only, Prep parents will be able to walk their child to and from their drop-off and pick-up point on the Basketball Court.

Last year our students and families proved that they were very comfortable with these arrangements. The teachers were also incredibly impressed by the growth in independence and resilience that was shown by our students using this system.

I hope that you can understand why we need to continue with these restrictions and support us with our processes.

COMPASS - School Management System

Templestowe Valley uses the **Compass** school management system. As in previous years, we will be sending ALL important messages through the Compass system and once again student/parent/teacher meetings will be booked through this system. All financial invoices and payments will be distributed through this system as well.

It is CRITICAL that **the family username and password are stored in a secure place** and this is the responsibility of the family. **If you lose it and need to reset your password, please contact the school office.** If you have difficulty with this process, please don't hesitate to contact the Office for assistance.

A reminder: Please inform the School Office staff if there are any changes with your residential address and contact and child's medical (Asthma/Anaphylaxis) details. It is critical that the School Office has accurate and up to date information.

This is a Department of Education and Training requirement.

Parents and guardians are reminded that the Department of Education and Training and Templestowe Valley Primary School <u>do not provide accident insurance or ambulance cover</u> for students. Parents and guardians of students who do not have student accident insurance and/or ambulance cover are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance, transport and any other related medical costs.



Student accident insurance and ambulance cover policies are available from some commercial insurers and can be obtained by parents and guardians for individual students. For further information please check with your personal insurance company.

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage. This can include mobile phones, electronic devices, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises.

COVIDSafe ~ Measures Extension ~ 17 February 2022

We want to thank parents and students for the great job they have done in keeping our school as safe as possible by following important COVIDSafe measures such as mask wearing, physical distancing, ventilation, getting vaccinated and rapid antigen testing.

This has meant that our school has remained open and our students in class. This is a fantastic outcome and a testament to the hard work of parents, carers, students and school staff.

RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS

To keep schools as safe as possible, the Victorian Government has extended the COVIDSafe measures introduced for the beginning of Term 1. This includes extending the availability of free rapid antigen tests (RAT) for screening until the end of term. It is anticipated an additional 24 million RATs will be provided to schools and early childhood settings to continue to support early detection and prevent infection, for use at home.

The need for this program will continue to be monitored, and may end earlier based on health advice. This is great news and will mean we're able to continue identifying COVID-19 cases as early as possible, reducing the impact on our school and individuals.

Department of Health modelling indicates that in the first two weeks of school returning, the program has already prevented more than 21,000 cases in schools alone. Their modelling indicates, assuming a 75 per cent compliance rate with screening of students, that by continuing RAT screening in schools for the full 10 weeks of Term 1, we will prevent:

- 61,000 COVID-19 infections in children aged 5 to 17
- more than 150,000 COVID-19 infections in the overall community (on average 15,000 per week over 10 weeks, or more than 2,100 per day)
- around 400 hospital admissions.

The Department will continue to supply RATs to our school for your use. Addition kits of Rapid Antigen Tests provided by the Victorian government will be given to each child on a Friday afternoon – fortnightly basis. Conditional to delivery, RAT tests will be sent home from TVPS on the following dates:

- Week 5 Friday February 25th
- Week 7 Thursday March 10th (Friday March 11th is a Pupil Free Day no students at TVPS)
- Week 9 Friday March 25th
- Week 11 Thursday April 7th (Last day of Term 1 is Friday April 8th)

This is to enable families to continue with the RAT protocol of testing children twice a week before they come to school - preferably on a Monday and a Wednesday - for the remainder of the term.

All of the boxes will be individually labelled, so the teachers will hand them to each child to put in their bag. They won't all be given to the eldest child. Please check your child's bag as soon as they come home.

- If a child is away, then the school will keep that test until:
 - 1. the child returns to school, or
 - 2. their parent comes to the Office to collect the test for them.
 - NB another adult/child will not be able to collect a RAT kit for someone else

Twice-a-week testing is strongly recommended for both students and staff. We suggest that RAT are done on a Monday and Wednesday each week.

Students will do the tests at home; they *only need to report their result if it is COVID-positive*. They must report a COVID-positive result to:

- the school via the <u>Student COVID-19 Test Portal</u> or phone; this is so we can support you and your child, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms
- the Department of Health via the <u>COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form</u> or call centre on <u>1800 675 398</u>.

Testing will be conducted at home, and students and staff must report any positive result. There is no requirement to report a negative result.

VACCINATION

Vaccination is another key component to protect students and staff in school settings.

Vaccinations for children aged 5 to 11 are open and third dose vaccinations for 16 to 17 year olds are now available.

There are lots of convenient options to access vaccinations. These include state-wide vaccination hubs, your local GP or pharmacy.

In addition, schools provide a trusted place among the community to access vaccination, particularly for families who may experience language or social barriers.

Following successful implementation of school pop-up clinics at the commencement of Term 1, more than 230 schools across Victoria are currently hosting mini-vaccination clinics led by GPs and pharmacists. Many of these clinics will also make vaccinations available the broader school community, inclusive of families of students and school staff.

VENTILATION

Improving ventilation is one of the most effective measures to keep education settings safe. 51,000 air purifiers were delivered to schools by Term 1, 2022 to support COVIDSafe settings in schools.

Up to an additional 60,000 air purifiers will be rolled out to schools ahead of winter to supplement natural and mechanical ventilation during the cooler months.

The winter allocation will provide enough purifiers to cover all classrooms, in government schools and low-fee non-government schools based on current enrolments. This includes general purpose classrooms and other specialist classrooms such as art and science rooms.

Mask rules will remain the same, with students in Grade 3 and above required to wear masks – although they will not be required outdoors.

On behalf of the school, I would like to thank you again for your continued support in helping your child to complete the rapid antigen tests and other COVID Safe measures. As a result of these efforts our school can continue providing a safe environment for students and staff.

During the ordinary course of your child's attendance at Templestowe Valley Primary School, school staff will collect your child's personal and health information when necessary to educate your child, or to support your child's social and emotional wellbeing or health in the school context. Such information will also be collected when required to fulfil a legal obligation, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law. If that information is not collected, the school may be unable to provide optimal education or support to your child or fulfil those legal obligations.

For example, health information may be collected through the school nurse, primary welfare officer or wellbeing staff member. If your child is referred to a specific health service at school, such as a Student Support Services officer, the required consent will be obtained. Our school also collects information provided by parents, guardians and carers through the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

At Templestowe Valley PS, we use online tools, such as apps and other software, to effectively collect and manage information about your child for teaching and learning purposes, parent communication and engagement; student administration; and school management purposes. When our school uses these online tools, we take steps to ensure that your child's information is secure. If you have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact us.

School staff will only share your child's personal or health information with other staff who need to know to enable the school to educate or support your child or fulfil a legal obligation.

When our students transfer to another Victorian government school, personal and health information about that student will be transferred to that next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of our students and assists that next school to provide optimal education and support to students.

In some limited circumstances, information may be disclosed outside of the school (and outside of the Department of Education and Training). The school will seek your consent for such disclosures unless the disclosure is allowed or mandated by law.

Templestowe Valley PS values the privacy of every person. When collecting and managing personal and health information, all school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law. 
