### **ANZAC DAY SERVICE**

Last Wednesday I had the immense pleasure of escorting our School Leaders — Lucy T and Aidan G - to the ANZAC Day Schools Service organised by the Rotary Club of Templestowe. Schools from across the City of Manningham were invited to attend the special service held in front of the cenotaph at the Templestowe Memorial Park.

In previous years all of our Year 6 students have attended the service, but with COVID-19 concerns in mind, this year only School Leaders were invited. At the end of the service, I asked Lucy and Aidan to reflect on what that had observed and heard and to write a piece that could be shared with all of our community. That piece is included below.



### ANZAC SERVICE REFLECTION

On Thursday April 28, at 12:00pm, we arrived at the Templestowe Memorial Park on Foote Street, ready to represent TVPS by wearing the yellow and blue colours proudly. We carried our school's wreath with pride. It had been generously made for our school by one of our past student's mum, Veri. We greeted all the representatives including ex-servicemen, the Mayor of Manningham Cr Michelle Kleinert, along with many other special and honourable guests.

After a warm welcome from the President of the Rotary Club of Templestowe, Luke Bastian, we listened to a very moving speech by Daryl Moran. He explained 3 main points about why ANZAC services are so important; to know how the soldiers gave their lives, how we will remember them and how we as the next generation can continue to honour their sacrifices. His speech was incredibly powerful and passionate, the main idea we took away was that soldiers, "Gave their today for our tomorrow."



Then it was time for us to have the incredible experience to lay down a wreath on behalf of our wonderful school TVPS. We slowly made our way down to the ANZAC memorial and laid down our beautiful wreath. We took the next few moments to think; to think about all the incredible soldiers, nurses and doctors that made this future possible for us.

The requiem was then read by the School Captains from Donvale Christian College, and then, the Past President of Templestowe RSL Subbranch, Brian Atherton, spoke the Ode. During the Minute of Silence, we took the time to reflect on the brave men and women who served and died fighting for our country's freedom. We paid our respects by standing still and bowing our heads as the Last Post was played and the flag raised.

We are very grateful to have this incredible opportunity to participate in this amazing experience, and to Ms Rees, we would like to thank her for sharing this unforgettable event with us. Finally, to thank those fallen soldiers who gave up their today so we could live our tomorrow. To everyone who is reading this, take away these 3 words, "Lest We Forget"

### **MAJOR SAFETY CONCERNS**

We once again major concerns about our children's safety on Cavendish Drive at pick-up and drop off times. It has been noted that parents are ignoring the signage and rules relating to the "Kiss and Go" Zone, and have been parking their cars, then standing on the footpath to chat to other parents.

Not only does this completely stall the flow of traffic, but it also means that the children have to walk around the parents. This has caused some children to move onto the road into the path of oncoming cars.

We're also concerned that children are being directed by parents to get into their car when it is either double parked, or in the flow of traffic, and also that they're getting into the car from the wrong side.



We ask that our Templestowe Valley community please keep our children safe by being respectful and obeying the road rules and signage.

Please remember that the school side of Cavendish Drive is a

### "KISS & GO" DROP OFF ZONE ONLY

between from 8:00 – 9:00am and again in the afternoon from 3:00 – 4:00pm.

### You are not allowed to park and leave your car.

It is a 2 minute drop off zone only.

- Drivers MUST remain in their vehicle in preparation for their child getting into the car.
- Cars move forward as students are picked up.
- If child has not got to the car within 2 minutes of arriving at the front of the line, then the driver needs to either:
  - 1. do a block of the school and re-join the end of the line, or
  - 2. find a place to park NOT in the "Kiss and Go" Zone and walk

If you are concerned about the behaviour of a particular driver, or the traffic situation, please make a report to the Manningham Council, <a href="https://www.manningham.vic.gov.au/contact-us/report">https://www.manningham.vic.gov.au/contact-us/report</a>. As a school we been petitioning the Manningham Council for a number of years for a crossing supervisor on Cavendish Road and nothing has happened. The more voices and concerns that can be added to ours, the more likely the chance of action being taken.

All of these things are within an individual parent's control. Please be responsible for your child's safety and the safety of our TVPS students.

In order to reduce the parking and congestion outside of the school and make it safe for our children, we would like you to consider

### walking your child/ren at least part of the way, to and from school.

This would reduce the hazards and would "switch" your child on for learning.

### NAPLAN - YEARS 3 & 5

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008. In 2019 The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Yrs 3 and 5 will be held in the third week of Term 2, starting on Tuesday May 9<sup>th</sup>. In Victoria, the NAPLAN Tests are administered by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCCA) on behalf of the Department of Education.

NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

<u>All students are expected to participate in the tests</u>. Students with disability may qualify for reasonable adjustments that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom. Some students with very specific circumstances may be exempted from participating in the tests. Please note that some of the information found on this page is given in multiple languages.

NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day. The use of services by coaching providers is not recommended.

In 2022, NAPLAN tests Australia wide will be an online assessment. NAPLAN online is described as a 'tailored test design' that adapts to correct and incorrect student responses, aimed at providing a more precise understanding of student achievement.

TVPS students will engage in at least one online practice test prior to the formal assessment, to help familiarise them with the format.

The dates and times of the testing are outlined in this table. Catch-up tests will be available for students who are absent on test days, up to and including Friday May 20<sup>th</sup>, (with the exception of Writing which must be completed on Tuesday May 10.

### **NAPLAN Tests Description:**

### Writing:

 Students are provided with a 'writing stimulus' (sometimes called a 'prompt' – an idea or topic) and asked to write a response in a particular genre (narrative or persuasive writing)

### • Reading:

 Students read a range of informative, imaginative and persuasive texts and then answer related questions

### Conventions of language:

This test assesses spelling, grammar and punctuation

### Numeracy

o This test assesses number and algebra, measurement and geometry, and statistics and probability

The best way for you to support your child with these formal assessments is to make sure they have a good night's sleep, followed by a healthy breakfast on the 'test days'. All tests will be administered in the first sessions of the school day, so please arrive at school in good time, without a rush or a fuss.

Later in the year, you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. This will describe your child's skills in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy as demonstrated in test conditions. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to the national minimum standards expected for students across Australia.

### Working with Children Checks

As part of the Templestowe Valley PS commitment to child safety, at their June 3, 2019 meeting, the TVPS School Council endorsed the <u>Child Safety Policy</u> which included the recommendation that all volunteers and visitors to TVPS be required to hold a current WWCC.



So, from the start of Term 3, 2019, <u>ALL</u> volunteers, contractors, visitors, etc. coming into TVPS during school hours, or helping/supervising with out-of-school hours events, such as the Disco, etc. will be required to hold a current <u>Working with Children Check</u> (WWCC).

This will include adults who are attending school to help in the classroom, at the canteen, during an excursion or in-school event, swimming or sport event, etc. – any event that might require them to be in contact with children or working within an area where children might be frequenting without supervision, e.g. the canteen/OSHC rooms.

### The requirement does <u>not</u> apply to:

- parents/carers or their delegates involved in the pick-up or drop-off of students at school.
- adults who are registered teachers, police officers or part of an allied service. (Not required to hold a WWCC in addition to the associated Police Check if part of their professional registration.)

### Obtaining a WWCC

- No cost when applied for in a volunteer capacity
- Online applications can be made at: https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/individuals/applicants/how-to-apply
- Please nominate Templestowe Valley PS as the place where the volunteer work will occur and we
  will be sent through an official copy of your card.

### TVPS WWCC Register

- A register of volunteers with a current WWCC will be maintained at TVPS
- Current WWCC registration please check at the TVPS Office to see if a copy is on file and you are on the register
- New applicants:
  - If volunteers nominate TVPS on their application form, TVPS will automatically receive a copy of their WWCC card when issued
  - If not, then volunteers are asked to take their valid WWCC card to the school Office where a copy will be made and included in the register
