Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome everyone to a new year at Templestowe Valley Primary School. We are looking forward to working with you and your children throughout the year.

Reading

Reading is an important skill for all students to learn. At school we operate reading sessions every day with your children to ensure they are learning important skills to help them grow. This may take the form of guided reading, shared reading, teacher directed reading, silent reading, reading for a purpose (information report, procedure etc), library sessions or reading for enjoyment. At home, you can help by reading with your child for at least 20 minutes per day. This can be with a picture story book, a reader, a chapter book or even a newspaper or magazine.

Did you know:

- •If a student reads at home for 20 minutes per day, they could hear up to 1.8 million words a year
- •If a student reads at home for 5 minutes per day, they could hear up to 282,000 words per year

If a student reads at home for 1 minute per day, they could hear up to 8,000 words per year.

District Swimming

Communication

We have two main forms of communication we use at school. Seesaw is used to communicate anything to do with the classroom. Staff will often send messages to the class or parents via Seesaw to remind them of upcoming events or to share what their children have been doing.

Compass is used to communicate with the whole school or with a Level of students. It is the main communication for newsletters, important messages and where families can view family details. Compass is also used for payments and bookings (such as Meet the Teacher, Attendance).

Staff will endeavour to check messages on Seesaw and Compass when they arrive at school in the morning and after school. They will try and read messages during their break at recess or lunch unless they have yard duty or a meeting. If you need to pass on a message during class time, please ring the office and they will contact the class teacher to pass on a message. Staff often can't read and/or respond to messages when they are teaching.

Drop off and Pick up

Just a reminder to parents to check the signs carefully when parking around our school. Please don't park in driveways or in No Standing zones. The local laws officers are patrolling to check the parking. Please also remind your children to use the school crossing and look both ways when crossing any roads.

Hats

Just a reminder that all students are required to wear their hats at school, especially Term 1 & 4 and on days when the UV level is 3 or above. Hats are available from the Uniform Shop. A 'No Hat, No Play' policy applies. Students without hats will stay in the undercover areas during recess and lunch times.

General Reminders
